



Heidi Muller & Bob Webb, Dulcimers in Hand

Saturday, 19 April, 7:30 PM

Three Rivers Folklife Society, 3 Rivers Dulcimer Society and the Battelle Staff Association have joined together to bring Heidi Muller and Bob Webb back to the Tri-Cities. Their show will feature Heidi's songwriting and crystalline vocals backed by Appalachian dulcimer, guitar, and Bob's electric cello and mandolin. They are known for an eclectic mix of original songs, traditional tunes and contemporary instrumentals.

The two musicians currently call Charleston, West Virginia, home. Heidi was a well-known performer in the Pacific Northwest for two decades before moving east six years ago. She met Bob at a Northeast Regional Folk Alliance conference. His multi-instrumental talents at accompaniment and skills as a recording engineer led to their further collaboration, and they began performing together in 2003. Heidi and Bob have appeared at the NewSong Festival, Augusta Heritage Center, Great River Road Festival, Tumbleweed Music Festival and Seattle Folklore Society concerts.

They have also shared the stage with Bill Staines, Robin and Linda Williams, Crooked Still, Kate Campbell, Johnsmith and Small Potatoes.

They released their first CD, "Seeing Things," in late 2005. "Seeing Things' reflects a sense of place, with stories and roots stretching from the Pacific Northwest to the Appalachians in the east. "Muller's songs express downto-earth sentiments in lovely poetry," writes Rich Warren of Sing Out! magazine. "She sounds like she truly loves singing and wants nothing more than to share that with you." The Victory Review describes the new songs as "created from true heart...sweeter, deeper and more meaningful than ever." Two tracks were written with the community of Big Ugly Creek, West Virginia, where Heidi has written songs and collected oral histories over the past two years for a book called "Patchwork Dreams." Described by Dulcimer Players' News as "one of the dulcimer community's best songwriters and performers," Heidi has shared her music across the country for over 25 years.

Bob Webb has played cello and gui-

tar since childhood, and dulcimer and mandolin for over 20 years. He was a founding member of Stark Raven, which became the house band for the public radio show "Mountain Stage." In his years on the show, he accompanied musical stars Odetta, Tom Paxton, Shawn Colvin, Arlo Guthrie and many others. Bob is a recording engineer and producer who saw his work with Ann Savoy included in the 2006 movie "All the King's Men."

Bob is also known at home for his work with children. He has directed the Great Oak Farm and Creative Capers kids' camps, taught over 700 children and adults to make and play his "boximer" cardboard dulcimers and is currently coordinator of the Music Mentors program that provides music lessons to low-income families in Charleston, West Virginia.

Heidi and Bob will be performing at Battelle Auditorium, on Battelle Blvd., in Richland. Tickets are \$12 gen./\$10 seniors and students in advance at Bookworm stores, BSA and Octopus' Garden. \$3 more at the door. 3RFS, BSA and TRDS members receive a \$3 discount.

Michael Carlos is a Coffeehouse and Tumbleweed Music Festival favorite. This will be the first time he has performed in the Tri-cities since his debilitating car accident. He has bounced back in style and we'll have the opportunity to show our appreciation at the April Coffehouse.

Michael can't be put into a box -

musically or personally. He was born to Spanish and Latin American immigrants then adopted by Czech and Lithuanian immigrants, by whom he was given the name Karl/Carlos Michael Polivka. The two-first-name combination represents his very American "melting-pot" experience, which is evident in his music. He draws on experience ranging from solo acoustic folksinging to playing in a series of

bar bands to creating an eclectic mix of rock, jazz/blues, Spanish/ Latin, alternative/country, and modern indie-rock.

Michael was recently praised by jambands.com as a "reincarnation of Warren Zevon (minus the chemical self-destructiveness)" for the brutally observant perspective on life reflected in his songwriting. The debut album, **Continued on Page 2.**

"Yesterday's Icons" was released in 2004. Despite modest exposure and a recent move to the Northwest from Chicago, The Illinois Entertainer, praised the "sincere, light-hearted" approach to political subject matter.

Michael and band were voted North Central Washington's Favorite Musician/ Band of 2005 in a Wenatchee World Readers Poll. They have performed on some of Seattle's big stages including the Northwest Folklife Festival, the University District Street Fair and a few of the small clubs around town.

As usual the coffeehouse will start with an open mic. We have to warn you, though, open mic performers have been turned away because so many are responding. So, come early or call Alan in advance, if you want a slot, because we might fill up. The Coffeehouse is held at the All Saints' Episcopal Church at 1322 Kimball, Ave., in Richland.
