Sky in the Road is an acoustic trio made up of Daniel Rhiger, Dean Warner, and Rahmana Wiest. They come to us from Portland, and have been making music together since 1998. Daniel plays guitar, Dean is usually found playing a mandolin, but also plays guitar, and pulls out lap steel, banjo, and fiddle on occasion. Rahmana plays harmonium and percussion.

Three-part harmonies are laced into their tunes, with the three of them trading lead. They describe themselves as carrying the torch of American folk, paying homage to people and places in their songs, spicing them up with eastern European and Celtic music, bluegrass, and jazz. Dan's songwriting has won awards, including two songs honored in Billboard Magazine's 1991 National Songwriting Contest.

With their well-crafted originals, these versatile performers have toured throughout the West, from the Oregon Coast to Billings, Montana, and from Monterey to the San Juan Islands. In 2005 they were featured on the nationally syndicated radio show "River City Folk." They have been heard at numerous concert halls, conferences, coffee houses and festivals including Seattle Folklife, Portland's Winterfolk Rose Festival, Artquake, Earth Day/ Procession of the Species, The Yakima Folklife Festival, and many more.

Sky in the Road also employs their musical talents in schools, with performances specifically created to teach children about recycling, water quality and salmon restoration. As part of a nonprofit educational organization they have reached nearly 200,000 students in the past six years through two programs, entitled "Make a Ripple, Make a Wave, AConcert for Clean Rivers," and "The Case of the Missing R's"

John Perry passed away on Friday, March 27, 2009, in Spokane due to complications from surgery. John was 66 and succumbed only after putting forth great effort through several surgeries in the last few months.

John and his wife Micki were among the original creators and founders of 3RFS more than 20 years ago. They have produced hundreds of concerts, provided warm home hospitality to countless musicians, and were the dreamers behind Tumbleweed Music Festival, now in its 13th year.

When we think of John, we picture him with a guitar (or banjo) in his hand, funky leather hat on his head, and Micki by his side.

John and Micki brought their love of folk from Beacon, New York, where they rubbed shoulders with the likes of Pete Seeger. They are now well known throughout the Northwest and beyond for their renderings of tradional folk music and the welcome mat they put out to anyone passing through. John will be missed by many.

Cowboy Up For Easter!

The annual Columbia River Cowboy Gathering is a three day event filled with western entertainment for the community to enjoy. The proceeds from the fund-raising event will benefit several organizations. The local organization sponsoring the gathering has a mission to preserve the western way of life by honoring the cowboy way of life and heritage through music, poetry, western arts and goods, keeping the festival wholesome, family oriented and at an affordable price.

This year's festival features singers, poets and storytellers, plus evening concerts. The Friday night concert has Wylie and The Wild West, Sourdough Slim, Shiloh Sharrard, Smoke Wade and others. Saturday night concert features Nevada Slim & Cimarron Sue, Johnny Counterfeit, a comedian, impressionist, and recording artist plus Smoke Wade, Sourdough Slim. Other featured performers include Bodie Dominguez and Hank Cramer.

You can expect lots of great vendors of cowboy-related products and food. There will be open mic sessions throughout Saturday and Sunday

A special cowboy Easter Sunrise service will take place Sunday, 6:00 – 7:30 am, and there's a Cowboy Easter Egg hunt on Saturday at 1:00 pm for children under age 10.

Regular tickets cost \$10/day in advance. VIP tickets are \$15/day for upfront seating at the evening concert. Prices double at the door. Sunday is free. Children 10 and under are free during the day but must pay for concerts.
