


Guitar Raffle Ends December 5!

Muller, Webb & Maher on a Long Good Road

Saturday, 5 December, 7:30 PM

Some of us "old timers" in Three Rivers Folklife Society remember way back when Dan Maher chose a new theme song for his weekly 'Inland Folk' radio program on Northwest Public Radio. That song was Heidi Muller's "Good Road," off her then-new CD, "Matters of the Heart." To celebrate two decades of 'Good Roads,' Dan, Heidi, and Heidi's musical partner, Bob Webb, are on a Northwest tour. They will present a concert of new and old material in the Tri-Cities on the first Saturday of this month.

Heidi Muller and Bob Webb perform an eclectic mix of original songs, traditional tunes and contemporary instrumentals. Currently based in Charleston, West Virginia, their performances feature Heidi's songwriting and crystalline vocals backed by both of them on guitar and Appalachian dulcimer, and by Bob on electric cello and mandolin. Heidi was a well-known performer in the Pacific Northwest for two decades before moving back home to New Jersey, where she met Bob at a Northeast Regional Folk Alliance conference. Bob's multi-instrumental talents at accompaniment (he's a 9-year veteran of the Mountain Stage Band) and skills as a recording engineer led to their further collaboration, and they began performing together in 2003. Heidi and Bob have shared the stage with Bill Staines, Robin and Linda Williams, Crooked Still, Kate Campbell, Johnsmith and Small Potatoes.

Heidi and Bob's CD, "Seeing Things" includes nine of Heidi's original songs, a cover of "I Will" by Lennon and McCartney, and three instrumentals that reflect a sense of place, stories and roots stretching from the Appalachians to the Pacific Northwest. "Muller's songs express down-to-earth sentiments in lovely poetry," writes Rich Warren of Sing Out! magazine. "She sounds

like she truly loves singing and wants nothing more than to share that with you." Victory Review describes the new songs as "created from true heart... sweeter, deeper and more meaningful than ever." Described by Dulcimer Players' News as "one of the dulcimer community's best songwriters and performers," Heidi has shared her music across the country for over 25 years, headlining at festivals including Kerrville and South Florida Folk, and opening for such artists as Nanci Griffith, Tanglefoot, Ramblin' Jack Elliott, Bill Staines and Jean Ritchie.

Bob Webb has played cello and guitar since childhood, and dulcimer and mandolin for over 20 years. He was a founding member of Stark Raven that became the house band for the public radio show 'Mountain Stage.' In his years on the show, he accompanied musical stars Odetta, Tom Paxton, Shawn Colvin, Arlo Guthrie and many others. Bob is also a recording engi-Contined on page 2. See Roads.

Laddie Ray Melvin Plays for Coffeehouse

Laddie Ray Melvin is a folk singer who has played music in the Pacific Northwest for many years. He is a songwriter who carefully crafts his lyrics and surrounds them with music from the American folk tradition. Country, blues, folk, and folk-rock are all colors in his musical palette.

Ray has produced two of his own independently recorded CDs: "Rocky Ground" and "In the Aftermath," a collection of tunes that considers what it means to be human in troubled times.

He also performs and records with musicians Brad Keeler and Lyle Morse.

For over three decades, Ray has played festivals like Northwest Folklife in Seattle, the Tumbleweed Music Festival in Richland, Washington, and many acoustic friendly venues like the Hot Club Coffee House in Troy, Montana, and the singer/songwriter showcase at The Dalles, Oregon. His work is sometimes heard on the radio show 'Inland Folk' on Northwest Public Radio and the 'Singer Songwriters on Sunday' show on

Q104. KEWU, the inland northwest's only jazz station, has played cuts from "Rocky Ground" as well, and Ray has appeared on Spokane public radio's "Nacho Celtic Hour."

The Coffeehouse will start with an open mic session. Come early to sign up, or call Alan Page at 943-5662. The Coffeehouse is held at All Saints' Episcopal Church, located at 1322 Kimball Ave., Richland (drive around to the lower parking lot in the back). Suggested donation at the door is \$8 general/\$6 senior and students.

neer and producer. Bob is known for his work with children. He directed programming at Great Oak Farm and Creative Capers kids' camps in West Virginia, taught over 700 children and adults to make and play his "boximer" cardboard dulcimers and helped develop the Music Mentors program that provides music lessons to at-risk children in Charleston, West Virginia.

Dan Maher, from Pullman, hosts Northwest Public Radio's 'Inland Folk' program and promotes folk music around the region. He is well known for his unlimited collection of folk songs and his boundless energy. Dan and Heidi are friends from way back, and love to join voices in duets.

The concert will be held at Battelle Auditorium, Battelle Blvd., Richland. Tickets are \$14 general admission/\$12 seniors and students in advance and \$2 more at the door (this is different from most concerts). 3RFS members get \$3 off and Battelle Staff members get \$1 off.
