

## **Seattle's SeaStar Brings Celtic to 3RFS**

Saturday, 6 December, 7:30 PM

SeaStar is a Celtic folk music band based in Seattle. The group originally formed as a duo in 2007 when songwriter Fae Wiedenhoeft began performing original, Celtic-influenced material with fellow guitarist Doug Hayman. The group's debut album, "SeaStar Blue," was recorded in 2008. In 2009, the duo released "SeaStar Black" with a mix of experimental material.

Fae Wiedenhoeft (vocals, guitar, penny whistles, and bodhran) has a velvet voice, a hearty laugh, and the traditions of the Celtic winds. Originally from Chicago, Fae's talent led her to the West Coast of Canada where she performed Celtic music professionally for 6 years. After 5 international CD releases, she moved stateside and produced over a dozen CDs with original content. When she is not writing songs or performing, Fae teaches voice, guitar, uke, Celtic

Studies, and songwriting lessons in her studio, Syren's Voice.

Michael Falcone (percussion, keys, vocals) began making music at the age of seven. In the early '90s, he began making home recordings and learned the art of sequencing, multi-tracking, and MIDI sound production. After joining the band Neon Wilderness in 1992, Michael toured various music venues in the Chicago area before branching out to record his own music under the name of 'Maestro Bizarro.' In the twenty-first century, Michael played hand percussion in the Pacific Northwest with world music group Hejira, klezmer group Klezterbalm and others, until finally finding a home with SeaStar. In his spare time, he is a filmmaker, voice-over artist and film location scout. He also likes cats.

Captain Chambers (bass) grew up in the early '70s Midwest, in the midst of vinyl records, eight track tapes and FM radio. The music came from Clapton, Fleetwood Mac, Steely Dan and Heart, with anecdotes of R&B, Motown and pop, yet always rooted deeply in rock and roll. He is an aficionado of rock, metal and new wave. Captain wields the electric bass as his musical interpreter. Captain is also a film maker, poet, and novelist. He is also the director and creator of the Blue November MicroFilmFest.

Kelly Blanchard (guitars, vocals) is a singer, songwriter, and owner of Green Arbor studios in Seattle. He first met SeaStar on a shared bill with his band Blue Star Creeper. A musical friendship and alliance developed, leading to an invitation to join SeaStar on second guitar and vocals. He also holds a certification in Sound Engineering from the University of Washington and has produced numerous projects out of his home studio Cleopatra Park. Humphrey, Hartman and Cameron is a Richland-based, neo-folk trio with a repertoire that includes whimsical blues, classic ballads, quirky music hall "camp," and straight-up folk anthems played on guitar, banjo, and cello. This December Three Rivers Folklife Society Coffeehouse performance will include some seasonal tunes as well. The trio has performed at concerts and festivals throughout the

Northwest and released several CDs of their music.

Janet Humphrey (guitar, vocals) has degrees in music theory and composition. She's done commercial arranging, fronted a six-man jug band and taught fingerstyle guitar. Mary Hartman (guitar, banjo, vocals) writes songs that cover topics from love and mercy to goose poop and rear-end "cleavage." Michelle Cameron's cello often provides a third voice to Humphrey and Hartman's alto tones. Michelle's

cello often does double duty, finding unique ways to sound like bagpipes or jazz sax.

There will be an open mic session to start off the evening. Come early to sign up if you want to perform because slots are limited. The coffeehouse is held at All Saints' Episcopal Church, 1312 Kimball Ave., Richland (drive around to the lower parking lot in the back). ## Micki's Graham Treats for All!

With the holidays approaching, here is the much-requested recipe for Micki Perry's easy graham toffee cookies that are so popular at 3RFS concerts. 1 cup butter or margarine Half cup sugar (white or brown) 1 1/2 packets of graham crackers 1/4 cup chopped nuts (your choice) Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Melt butter or margarine (I use half of each) in a saucepan on top of stove. When melted, add sugar. Bring to a boil and boil for 3 minutes.

Meanwhile line a rimmed cookie sheet with foil and lay quarters of graham crackers side by side to fill pan. Crackers break in half easily but to make quarters it is best to saw with a serrated knife.

Finally chop nuts. When butter and sugar mixture has boiled for 3 minutes, pour mixture all over the crackers, then sprinkle on nuts. Place sheet in heated oven for about 5 minutes until bubbly. Take out and cool until they are set up (about 5 minutes.) Break apart and serve or put in tin.
