Tom Rawson Catches 3RFS in His New Release

Saturday, 3 February, 7:30 PM

Saying that **Tom Rawson** sings folk songs and tells stories is like saying Lance Armstrong rides bicycles. In the style of the great Pete Seeger, Tom is at the top of his craft. He's a master of warmth and wit that draws his audience in to feel and participate in his music.

Tom has been singing and storytelling on stage for about half of his fifty plus years. He is a song collector with a goal of spreading the songs of contemporary songwriters as well as keeping some of the older traditional songs alive. If his name sounds familiar, Tom has performed for 3RFS at the Grange and the Tumbleweed Music Festival, and regional events including Northwest Folklife Festival, Victoria Folk Music Society Concerts,

and Seattle 2nd Sunday House Concerts.

Tom has performed with folk music favorites Bill Staines, Linda Allen, and Anne Weiss. Tom is also the songleader at The Fellowship of Reconciliation annual regional conference at Seabeck, Washington, and an instructor at the Puget Sound Guitar Workshop. As well as teaching elementary school and performing, Tom maintains an abiding love of the railroads, having logged thousands of miles by boxcar across North America. He's also an avid trout fisherman, which could be why (he explains) he is such a great storyteller.

Tom's latest CD, "Where the Coho Flash Silver," was recorded live at the Victoria Folk Music Society, Victoria, BC, in April, 2006. It's the next best thing to being at one of Tom's concerts, containing fourteen contemporary and traditional folk songs. Tom weaves his sing-along magic with the voices of the enthusiastic Victoria folk music community. Back-up is provided by Calvin Cairns, Janet Stark, Kim Willoughby, Margaret Chilibeck, Rick van Krugel, Jake Galbraith, Denis Donnelly, and Greg La Riviere.

If you've seen him before, you'll be there and if you haven't, come see what you've missed! (Look for Pete Seeger's autograph on Tom's banjo!)

You can get the new CD and experience an actual LIVE performance at the Kennewick Highlands Grange, 15th and Union. Tickets for this concert are available in advance for \$11 gen./ \$9 seniors and students, at Bookworm stores, Battelle Performing Arts Business Center, and Octopus' Garden. Tickets cost \$1 more at the door. 3RFS members receive a \$3 discount on concert tickets.

Doug Rice Returns to Coffeehouse

Doug Rice's eclectic performance style is due, in part, to being steeped in so many musical styles from an early age. Music has always played a big part in Doug's family. His dad gave him a 4-string tenor guitar to play at the age of five and he's been hooked ever since.

In high school, Doug joined the Wayne McGuffin big band and studied guitar with local guitar icon, John LaChappelle. In college, Doug kept busy performing in several Jazz and Fusion groups and teaching private lessons. A highlight of his college career was studying classical guitar with James Reid, from the University of Idaho. It was his years with Reid and Doug's love of Jazz that really influenced his interest in fingerstyle guitar.

Doug graduated from Washington State University with degrees in music and education and taught instrumental music at Richland High School for 10 years before taking a job with Pacific Northwest National Laboratory. Making the career change from being a high school band director has, interestingly, opened up so many opportunities for Doug in music and has given him more time to pursue his musical interests (composing, recording, performing, and teaching).

Doug currently performs around the Tri-Cities as a soloist and as a member of several performing groups. He plays guitar for the Columbia Basin Jazz Orchestra and has played on various church worship teams. Doug also plays in two other bands: the Calypsonian Bandits (an Afro-Cuban/calypso quartet) and Times 2 (a top-40/oldies band).
