

Janis Carper and Cris Peterson

Saturday, 15 February, 7:30 PM

Janis Carper and Cris Peterson, two of the Northwest's finest acoustic musicians, join forces for our February concert. Janis Carper might be described as what you get when you take Bonnie Raitt, Shawn Colvin, Rosanne Cash and Lucinda Williams and put 'em in a blender, add a dash of Kevin Welch and Bruce Cockburn, serve in a salted glass, no straw. Janis's clear, powerful vocals and aggressive guitar playing skillfully convey the messages of her well-crafted songs, in styles ranging from country and swing to folk, rock and blues.

Winning songwriting awards at festivals including the Kerrville Folk Festival in Texas, Janis has also toured internationally in the off-broadway hit "Woody Guthrie's American Song." Her 1992 recording "No Place to Land" was chosen as one of the top twelve independent recordings by The Performing Songwriter magazine. Peter, Paul & Mary released "Of This World," co-written by Janis with Becca Christel Palm and Tracy Spring.

Janis Carper is no stranger to 3RFS audiences as she performed many times in the early days solo and with other songwriters in 4 Women at Play and Crystal, Spring and Carper which became 29 Toes. She now lives in Enterprise, Oregon, where she is the director of the Wallowa Valley Music Alliance, a small non-profit. In the early 80's she was in a country/rock band with guitarist/fiddler Cris Peterson. The two have reunited and are now a couple as well as a musical duo.

Multi-instrumentalist and songwriter Cris Peterson began playing violin at age 6 and picked up the guitar in his early teens. He studied violin at the University of Idaho where he eventually became concertmaster of the symphony.

After college, Cris moved on to follow his interest in country/rock and folk music, touring with a variety of bands around the Northwest and Canada playing electric guitar, fiddle and mandolin. He moved away from the Northwest in the mid-80s, returning to Moscow, Idaho, in 2001, where he has enjoyed playing in local bands.

Cris cites Duane Allman and Eric Clapton among his guitar influences, and enjoys the supportive role of playing in bands, where he is able to tap into his skills as a multi-instrumentalist and singer.

Musically Janis and Cris combine top-notch songwriting, and superb vocal harmonies with multi-intrumental skills with a roots/Americana style. As a duo they perform co-written originals plus originals each one brings to the mix. Their sound combines influences of rock, blues and folk and their love story unfolds as they perform their "songs drawn from the well," which happens to be the title of their album. February Coffeehouse Features Steve Cary

Local guitarist and singer/songwriter Steve Cary has been performing since he was 5, and writing music since he was 14. With a broad variety of influences – Folk-Rock to Latin, Big Band to Reggae– he calls his musical blend "Free Range Fusion." Steve grew up in Corvallis, Oregon, singing every kind of music he could in choirs, bands, and as a soloist. He has performed classical, swing, jazz, folk, rock, and spirituals throughout the West Coast. Fluent in Spanish, he writes in both English and Spanish – some songs in both. Steve is probably best-known to Tri-Cities audiences as the songwriter for the popular (but now disbanded) blues band Romagossa Blu. Since many of Steve's songs are about love of some kind, he'll be the

perfect performer for Valentine's Day!

International Mother Language Day

Sunday, 23 February, 2:00 PM

Languages are the most powerful expressions of preserving and developing our heritage. Use of our mother tongue encourages linguistic and cultural diversity, promotes multilingual education, and develops awareness of solidarity based on understanding, acceptance and dialogue. In 1999, **UNESCO's General Conference pro**claimed February 22 as International Mother Language (IML) Day. The day has been observed every year since to promote linguistic and cultural diversity and multilingualism.

Folk Music Losses

Pete Seeger - May 3, 1919-January 27, 2014

Micki Perry learned of Pete Seeger's death while performing at Adult Day Services in Kennewick on January 28, and wrote the following -

"I was doing classic Burl Ives' songs but ended up singing "If I Had A Hammer," "Where Have All the Flowers Gone?" and "Oh, Had I a Golden

Thread." My cousin Abby's facebook page included a story from Arlo Guthrie, who called Pete in the hospital the night before he died. When Arlo got the news of Pete's death, his response was "Pete died but he's not gone!"

John and I had the privilege to know Pete as a friend, father figure and mentor when we lived in his home town, Beacon, New York. John actually followed Pete as President of the Beacon Sloop Club in 1976. It was such a blessing for us to know Pete and his wife Toshi, who died last year, as individuals and friends instead of idols.

Pete Seeger will live on in all of our memories as a voice crying in the wilderness, a conscience of our nation. He was from our parents' generation but struck a chord in every generation since, reminding us it is our duty to sing out for justice, for freedom and for peace and to work to build our community and save our planet."

TR Ritchie - January 29, 2014

TR Ritchie died peacefully Wednesday, January 29, with Tracy Spring at his side. TR was raised in Oklahoma but moved to the Northwest as a young man. While working at a forest lookout station in Oregon, TR learned to play the guitar changing the direction of his life. He began writing his own songs and was soon part of a circle of Seattle songwriters that included Heidi Muller, Janis Carper, Kat Eggleston and Karen Blaine. He was a regular at 3RFS concerts and coffeehouses in the early days. After he moved to Moab, Utah, he returned here often for concerts, and Tumbleweed. He relocated to Bellingham a few years ago as his friendship with Tracy Spring turned into love.

TR was not only a great songwriter but also a poet and artist with a selfpublished work, Words on Paper, full of his own drawings as well as his poems and musings. He will probably be best remembered for his songs "White Bark" and "Somewhere to Begin." Play his music and remember the great troubador-poet who touched so many hearts and lives.
