

3RFS Presents Dan Weber In Concert

Saturday, 18 January, 7:30 PM

Award-winning songwriter Dan Weber comes to Three Rivers Folklife Society country for his first full-length concert, having performed at the last two Tumbleweed Music Festivals, where he was a headliner at the 2013 evening show.

Dan has been described as "The classic mid-life overnight sensation." A gifted storyteller but still relatively new to songwriting, Dan was a 2012 finalist in the legendary Kerrville (Texas) "New Folk" competition as well as the prestigious Dave Carter Songwriting Contest in 2010. Dan was also a winner of the West Coast Songwriter's Performing Songwriter Competition in 2011 and 2009 along with two "Song of the Year" awards.

Following in the long tradition of great singer/songwriters, Dan entertains audiences with inspired and energetic performances, telling hilarious, true stories from the many roads he has traveled. He tells of how he moved from New York state to the Northwest: "One night back home in

1989 at a local bar on Water Street, I ran into this guy named 'Joe' fresh out of the Army, who said he was moving to Spokane the next day. I bought him a drink to help him celebrate, then he bought me one to help me help him celebrate. Before I knew it, I found myself in the passenger seat of his 1978 primer-grey Pontiac Trans-Am, headed west."

Dan's songs are both heartbreaking and funny, and are rich in imagery, history, and full of life's hopes and ironies. Songs from his CD, "Ash and Bone," have received accolades from American Songwriter Magazine, the Great American Songwriting Contest, the Great Lakes Songwriting Contest as well as recognition from DJs.

Folk troubadour legend Ramblin' Jack Elliott said "I love Dan's songs and he tells really good stories" and The Victory Review magazine writes "Weber's writing is as strong as any in the contemporary folk community. "Goodbye to Dad" is one of the best original tunes that I have heard in a long time."

Dan has played shows in some

amazing places! Like on vintage railroad cars with Ramblin' Jack Elliott, and on the Columbia River at Bonneville Dam's 75th Anniversary for Woody Guthrie's 100th Birthday celebration. His shows are as much a conversation with the audience as they are a performance. His hilarious stories between songs often take on a life of their own, forming the backdrop for his literate, funny, poetic and often heartbreaking songs. Dan's inspired and energetic performances are one-of-a-kind and sometimes they're impromptu like shows in train stations, living rooms and even on the rim of the Grand Canyon. But no matter where they happen, each one is special.

Dan will perform at the Community Unitarian Universalist Church, 2819 W. Sylvester St., in Pasco. Tickets are \$11 general admission/\$9 seniors and students if purchased in advance at Bookworm stores and Octopus' Garden and are \$1 more at the door. 3RFS members receive a \$3 discount.


