

3RFS is pleased to sponsor a musical program from Humanities Washington by Hank Cramer: "One Trail, Many Voices: Songs of the Oregon Trail." The version of the Oregon Trail journey that most of us learned as children presents hardy, American-born pioneers heading west for adventure. The truth is far different. This vast stream of "emigrants" was a hugely diverse group, and for the most part was fleeing something – whether they were Easterners fleeing the financial Panic of 1837, Irish immigrants flee-

ing the potato famines, blacks escaping slavery, or Germans and Italians fleeing civil war. Along their way, Native Americans seldom attacked – in fact, many emigrant groups would not have made it without their aid.

Folksinger and storyteller Hank Cramer will share the traditional folk songs of these cultures and explore how immigration via the Oregon Trail affected the travelers, their songs, and the culture of the Pacific Northwest.

The show will be presented at the HUB at Columbia Basin College in Pasco. There is no admission charge.

June 14 is Flag Day

Recently we learned a few facts from the National Flag Day Foundation's website. Flag Day originated June 14th, 1885, when Bernard J. Cigrand, a 19 year old teacher in a one-room schoolhouse, in Waubeka, Wisconsin, placed a flag on his desk and told his students to write a theme on the significance of the U.S. Flag. President Wilson proclaimed the national observance of Flag Day in 1916 and in 1949, President Truman signed an Act Of Congress designating the 14th day of June every year as a day to honor our flag. A few tips about flag etiquette:

- 1. The flag should be lighted at all times.
- 2. The flag should be flown in fair weather, unless it's designed for inclement weather.
- 3. The flag should never be used for advertising. Advertising signs should not be attached to the staff or halvard.
