# **Get Irish With Skweez the Weezle!**

#### Saturday, 15 March, 7:30 PM

Skweez the Weezle is an acoustic band that has proudly carried on the Celtic music tradition since March 1999, from their base of operations in the Tri-Cities. Their current repertoire includes traditional and original tunes and songs from Scotland, Ireland, Cape Breton Island, Brittany, Wales, and the USA.

Founding member David Lanigan plays both Scottish Border pipes and smallpipes (bellows-blown bagpipes with three drones in a common stock,) Scottish Highland pipes, whistles (commonly called tin or penny whistles, although they are not currently made of tin or cost a penny!), and Irish Octave Mandolin (a four-course stringed instrument in the low end of the mandolin family).

Troy Hanford has also been with the band since the beginning. He plays

guitar (a McMartin or MacMartin, depending on whether he's playing an Irish or a Scottish tune) and sings lead vocals. Troy finds Celtic music challenging, but immensely rewarding.

Mike Day has been playing music most of his life. He started playing guitar at a very young age, but soon found that his true passion was for banging on the drums, much to his parents' chagrin. Mike joined Skweez the Weezle in 2005, playing bodhràn (an open-backed Irish frame drum played with the hand or a wooden tipper), djembe (Afro-Celtic hand drum), shaky egg, and singing background vocals.

Glenn Mortenson plays Irish bouzouki, mandolin, cittern, fiddle, and sings backing vocals. He came to the Tri-Cities from Seattle as a professional traveling musician and decided to stay. Glenn started out as a drummer/percussionist/vocalist. He added several types of stringed instruments over the years, and now plays them exclusively.

For the past fifteen years, Skweez the Weezle has performed throughout the Northwest at festivals, concerts, Highland games, coffeehouses, wineries, bookstores, universities, weddings, receptions, and private parties. We can assure you that no weasels are harmed during their performances.

Skweez the Weezle will perform at the Community Unitarian Universalist Church, 2819 W. Sylvester St., Pasco. Tickets are \$11 general admission/\$9 seniors and students if purchased in advance at Bookworm stores and Octopus' Garden and are \$1 more at the door. 3RFS members receive a \$3 discount.

## **MIchael Carlos Returns to the Coffeehouse**

Not your usual singer/songwriter act, Michael Carlos writes music that ranges from full-throttle rock, to Latin-influenced music, to acoustic ballads with strings.

Michael grew up California's San Joaquin Valley and now works out of Wenatchee, Washington. As a Latino child adopted by Caucasian parents, Carlos was often mistaken as the son of migrant farm workers. His experiences living in San Joaquin Valley's cultural divide and the search for his own identity has helped to shape his music, which critics have lauded for covering a "wide range of musical territory." Michael draws from a diverse array of styles, ranging from indie rock, alt-country, Latin, pop and blues. He sees his music as one way of bridging the cultural divide and connecting with his audiences, both Anglo and Hispanic.

As a child, Michael learned piano from his grandmother, who was a ragtime pianist. He later picked up the guitar, which he taught himself to play by listening to blues recordings.

He also plays harmonica and the accordion.

The Coffeehouse will start with an open mic session. Come early to sign up for a slot. As a special treat this time, we'll celebrate "Pi Day" with pie! See related article inside.

Another "pi" thought from Alan Gibbs, our intrepid web site manager. Mathematicians grew tired of degrees, so invented the radian. That's the angle created by wrapping a radius around part of a circumference. Since it takes pi diameters to go all the way around, and since the radius is half as long, it takes 2 pi radii to go around. It follows that every pie contains 2 pi radians or one pie = two pi. So keep in mind while eating pie you are getting twice as many calories as you think!
