

Progressive Bluegrass from Wry Dry Band

Saturday, 12 May, 7:30 PM

Badger Mountain Dry Band, the Tri-Cities' only progressive bluegrass band, has been a terrific, loyal supporter of our Tumbleweed Music Festival for years. They will perform in concert to promote the festival and help recruit volunteers.

For 15 years the Badger Mountain Dry Band has brought their brand of music to the Pacific Northwest. Playing traditional bluegrass instrumentation, the group's music includes traditional bluegrass standards, original Gospel material, 60's rock and roll, swing tunes, big band tunes, old country standards, and more. The "Dry" in this band's name refers to the use of non-electric instruments - the music is anything but "dry!"

Band members include Jim Honeyman on mandolin, John April on guitar and banjo, Chuck Peden on guitar, Joe Smart on guitar and fiddle, and Kurt Gustafson on stand-up bass. Joe was the winner of the 2005 Walnut Valley Flatpicking contest held in Winfield, Kansas.

The concert will be held at the Battelle Auditorium, Battelle Blvd., Richland. Tickets are available in advance for \$11 gen./\$9 srs and students at Bookworm stores, Battelle Performing Arts Business Center, and Octopus' Garden. \$1 more at the door; \$3 off for 3RFS members.

The Wanderers Concert Free to Members!

Saturday, 19 May, 7:30 PM

The Wanderers are the feature artists at this year's annual meeting. (Free to members.) The band made up of Carl Allen and Bill Murlin, are regular performers at Tumbleweed Music Festival. Carl and Bill met in a folk trio at WSU, Pullman, in 1959. After winning a talent show, the trio, including Al Hansen, appeared at WSU dances and functions.

The trio split up after college, but Carl and Bill got together a few years later. The trio started annual reunions, so they've been together for 45 years!

Bill and Carl revived the Columbia River songs written by Woody Guthrie in 1941. Bill found and published 17 of Guthrie's Northwest songs. He also produced an album of Woody's recordings of 17 of those songs.

Carl has done musical sound tracks

for three documentaries for KCTS-TV channel 9, Seattle.

The Wanderers feature folk songs from the 1950s to today. Their long-awaited recording, "It's About Time' is now available.

The concert will be held at the Kennewick Highlands Grange, 15th and Union. Admission is FREE for 3RFS members! Others can join at the door, or pay the usual ticket prices.

Les Barker Brings Humor & Music to Grange

Saturday, 16 June, 7:30 PM

Poet/comedian Les Barker is a writer of strange poems and comes to us from England. He performed at the 3RFS Coffeehouse several years ago and packed the house. He was a professional accountant before he became a professional idiot! Les began his performing career as an assistant to Mrs. Ackroyd, a small, hairy mongrel who laid around in folk clubs, bit people and became famous. Mrs. Ackroyd was the only dog ever to own a record label. Since her sad demise, Les has mainly been a solo performer, though he does

work with humans from time to time. He has traveled Great Britain, Hong Kong, Australia, New Zealand, the United States and Canada. His poems have spawned a number of folk heroes, including Jason and the Arguments, Cosmo the Fairly Accurate Knife Thrower, and Spot of the Antarctic.

The Mrs. Ackroyd Band, has four albums: "Oranges & Lemmings," "Gnus & Roses," "Tubular Dogs," and "Yelp!" Les has written 76 books, which sell in large numbers at his gigs because people don't quite believe what they've just heard. There are also five highly acclaimed albums of Les's serious work:

the folk opera "The Stones of Callanish," "Some Love," "The Wings of Butterflies," "Airs of the Dog," and "Twilight of the Dogs," all involving a galaxy of talent.

His serious songs have been recorded by Martin Carthy and Dave Swarbrick, June Tabor, The Kingston Trio and Tom Paxton.

Datri Bean, New at the Coffeehouse

Steeped in hot, muggy weather, love, God and corn whiskey, songwriter Datri Bean, in her first appearance at the 3RFS Coffeehouse, will blend 1930s jazz with folksy Americana.

Datri was raised in a rodeo family, in Wyoming, listening to her mother's scratchy Scott Joplin records. She later studied at the Boston Conservatory of Music, then high-tailed it for Austin, TX, landing in a big house full of hooligans, jazz musicians, exchange students, and bike mechanics. Love dragged Datri kicking and screaming to Seattle. She soon returned to Austin to record her ten-song, all-original debut album, "Slow Down Summertime." About.com named her one of the "best folk artists you've never heard of."

She has been touring the United States, and was recently honored by the Kerrville New Folk, Telluride, and Rocky Mountain folk festivals for her songwriting.

You can find her at All Saints Episcopal Church, 1322 Kimball, in Richland. The coffeehouse begins at 7:30 PM with an open mic session. Come early to sign up for a slot.
