IN CONCERT THE BLOW-INS OCTOBER 18TH, SATURDAY, 7:30PM

The Irish have a term for strangers who pop into town: Blow-ins. That's also the name of a folk duo comprised of Dave Dylan on guitar & vocals and Tom Canning on bass guitar and backing vocals. Although neither is originally from Ireland, the duo is based in Dingle, Ireland, and they primarily focus on Irish songs, along with a sprinkling of modern and traditional music, and peppered with plenty of banter and bad jokes. They particularly love to interact with the audience and really draw them in to the musical experience.

Dave Dylan moved to Dingle on a whim in 2002, leaving a job with an IT company in London and having no experience of playing live music. After bartending and waiting tables for a year, he began to perform semi-professionally in Dingle's bars in the summer of 2003. He began playing solo in 2005 and by 2006 was playing music 6 nights a week during the summer season in Dingle and Killarney.

Tom originated from Hartford, Connecticut. His mother's side of the family has its ancestry on the Dingle Peninsula, which is what took him there in 2006. Tom and Dave met in a small music store in Dingle, and they have been playing music together in Dingle ever since. During the summer season from May to September, they play together as a folk duo 3 or 4 nights every week in hotel bars and pubs in the town, entertaining visitors from around the world with a mixture of traditional Irish folk tunes, contemporary favorites and off-the-cuff banter. The vast majority of the people they meet at gigs are from the US, so they thought it a good idea to bring their brand of folk music to our doorstep.

Even after having entertained thousands of people, visitors and locals alike, The Blow-Ins still look forward to having fun each time they play, and involving the audience guarantees that no two nights are ever the same.

The concert will be held in the Community Unitarian Universalist Church, 2819 W. Sylvester St., in Pasco. Tickets are \$11 adults, \$9 seniors and students if purchased in advance at Kennewick Bookworm or Octopus' Garden and are \$1 more at the door. 3RFS members receive \$3 off on tickets.

Saturday, 4 October, 7:30 PM

The husband and wife duo. Curtis and Loretta, offer extraordinary harmonies and proficiency on a parade of stringed instruments. They create an alluring frame for their poignant original songs, and carefully chosen traditional pieces from the British Isles, America, and beyond. The current menagerie includes Celtic harp, mandocello, mandolin, quitars, clawhammer banjo, and National steel ukulele, plus a bit of kazoo, harmonica, and shakers. Curtis' down-home sense of humor and Loretta's theater background engage the audience in an experience that runs the gamut of rolling with laughter to holding back tears, with plenty of side-trips in between.

The duo married twenty-four years ago in Santiago. Mexico. Ten years earlier, in the spring of 1977, they had chanced to meet each other on the beach just outside Santa Cruz, California. Love was born, a duo was formed, and they took to the road, hitchhiking up and down the West Coast, playing in cafes, and on the street.

Over the next three decades, Curtis Teague and Loretta Simonet's harmonies have gotten tighter than ever, their stage presence has blossomed, and they've graduated from the street to dedicated fans at folk clubs across the U.S. They've racked up countless miles over the years, crisscrossing the country to deliver their own unique brand of folk singer/songwriter music. They've shared billings with Jez Lowe, Vassar Clements, Pete Seeger, Arlo Guthrie, Anne Hills, Greg Brown, Holly Near, and Bill Staines, to name just a few.

Their heartfelt original songs have won them fans throughout the U.S. and overseas. Curtis & Loretta revel in writing songs about the heroism and integrity of reallife, ordinary people, often people they actually know. "Angel of Bergen-Belsen" is the story of Luba Tryszynska, a holocaust survivor who saved 54 children during World War II. Curtis & Loretta sought her out and met her after writing the song, and visited her four times at her home in Miami. "Gone Forever" tells the heart wrenching story of Loretta coming to terms with her dad's Alzheimer's. "Elza and Branko (The Siege of Sarajevo)" details the love and bravery of a couple living through the Balkan wars. Curtis & Loretta located Elza (now a widow) and were in contact with her for many years.

Larry Murante Coffeehouse

Larry Murante is a songwriter who sings with compassion and joy. His songs are beautifully woven stories about every day folks, combining socially conscious lyrics and an upbeat, energetic folk/rock style. Jackson Brown, Lyle Lovett, Hal Ketchum and Michael McDonald are all reflected in his music. Larry is known for his soaring, mellifluous tenor, a strong rhythmic guitar style, and an engaging stage presence. His story songs proclaim the extraordinary in the ordinary: a veteran's impassioned display of the American Flag, or the backyard mechanic/Vietnam vet who comes to terms with his life, or the preacher's wife who haunts the parsonage of a small Northwest town.

With his third CD release, Point Of Entry, Larry has racked up a fresh string of accolades, the most notable being the Grand Prize Winner in the folk category of the international John Lennon Songwriting Contest. Larry was also a finalist in the prestigious Kerrville Grassyhill Newfolk Song Competition in Kerrville, Texas, the International Acoustic Music Awards (IAMA) and a recent winner of the West Coast Songwriters International Songwriting Contest. He was also selected as a Premier Showcase Artist at the Far West Folk Alliance Conference in 2010 and 2011 and an official showcase Artist at the 2010 North American Folk Alliance Conference in Memphis.

Larry tours nationally, performing a mix of folk concerts, festivals, radio interviews and house concerts and has shared the stage with such artists as Peter Mulvey. Christine Lavin, Greg Greenway, Pierce Pettis, David Broza, Alice Stewart, Cosy Sheridan, Laura Love, and Bill Morrissey.
